


WE'VE BEEN MAKING IMPROVEMENTS
















LUTHER MANOR DEBUTS ITS FIRST ORIGINAL DRAMA

Independent Living apartments are furnished with appliances upon move-in. As it makes sense to do so, appliances are replaced with newer models and the older ones find their way to a storage closet in Luther Manor's basement. When the inventory of refrigerators and stovetops gets high enough, our friends at Habitat for Humanity stop by to pick up these gently used appliances to sell at their ReStore locations around town. A family is able to purchase a deeply discounted appliance and Habitat for Humanity, through the proceeds, is able to provide housing to those in need.

AN EXCITING NEW REHAB OFFERING

Luther Manor is proud to announce an exciting new service for our residents and patients, in partnership with Integrated Rehab Consultants (IRC). Effective immediately, IRC will provide physiatrist services to all patients on our Rehab unit.

WHAT IS A PHYSIATRIST?

A physiatrist is a medical doctor who has completed training in the specialty of Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation. They are able to diagnose and treat pain as a result of an injury, illness or disabling condition.

WHAT VALUE WILL A PHYSIATRIST BRING TO REHAB PATIENTS?

Previously, pain associated with a patient's physical therapy was diagnosed and treated by the patient's primary physician. Going forward, IRC will be able to provide the evaluation, diagnosis and treatment while remaining in constant communication with primary physicians. Their close relationship with patients including initial evaluation, regular monitoring and follow-up will help reduce readmissions.

The relationship between Symbria (physical therapy provider), IRC (physiatrists) and primary doctors means increased communication, faster care, greater patient satisfaction and better outcomes for all Luther Manor rehab patients.

Aloha! After performing authentic hula dances at a luau presentation, the dancers stayed for photo opportunities.








During the month of May, in order to celebrate Older Americans Month,

IN MEMORIAL OF NANCY LEE TRUBY

Nancy Lee Truby, born September 13, 1934 and wife of Rev. William H. Truby (Luther Manor's first Executive Director), went to her eternal home with God on August 24, 2018.

Pastor Truby and his beloved "Nancy Lee" served Luther Manor from the day it first opened in 1961 until his retirement in 1992. Nancy volunteered at Luther Manor from October of 1972 until December of 2016. having served a total of 4.471 hours. She helped put up Christmas decorations and was a dedicated member of what was known as the "Birthday Ladies" in Luther Manor's Health Care Center, a group of women who arranged monthly birthday celebrations for residents. In February of 2001, Nancy received Luther Manor's Good Samaritan Award for her work as a member of that aroup. Nancy was famous for the peppermint bark she made and distributed throughout the holidays.

Nancy and Pastor Truby were honored on April 15, 2012 by having a building formerly known as the Special Care Center rededicated as the William H. and Nancy Lee Truby Pavilion. One who knew Nancy well said of her, "She was always very gracious. She always greeted others warmly. A lovely Christian woman and devoted to her family and Luther Manor. What a team she and Pastor Truby made!"

Nancy enjoyed gardening, knitting, birdwatching, reading and, most of all, cherishing the time spent with her loving family.

Luther Manor is grateful for the time and efforts Nancy so willingly gave to us throughout her life.
