


Luther Manor Continuing Precautions Related to COVID-19 June 17, 2020 4:38 pm

• Thank you to the family of a post-COVID rehab resident who we helped get back to full strength! Their mother was our first post-COVID graduate, whose name is blanked out in the card below due to HIPAA:). Many long-time readers (I know that is sad to say) know that back in April we designated one wing of our Rehab area to help clinically resolved COVID-19 patients. These patients were not residents previously, they passed the stage of requiring acute hospital care and are deemed medically stable, yet need additional time to recuperate. The Coronavirus virus leaves people in a weakened state and typically with a residual cough or other complications. Their bodies needed rest and rehabilitation and the hospitals could no longer keep them. Our facility was able to separate this wing and staff to help nurse them back to health and full strength. Luther Manor's vision is "leading the way in abundant living for all who trust us to care." We are pleased to say we have been able to help many more get back to their daily lives!








Campus Update

• Today, we learned that a resident in our Courtyards assisted living program tested positive for COVID-19. This resident has been moved to our observation unit in the health care center that is designed to care for COVID patients (mentioned above). All staff and the families of those having loved ones in the area have been notified. If you didn't receive a call from us, your loved one is not affected. Following discussions with the Wauwatosa Department of Health, we will test all residents in the program. Once that is complete, we will begin testing all staff in the program area as well. You know that since mid-March, we have been conducting vitals checks on all health care center and assisted living residents three times per day. We also monitor them for symptoms to help us identify any changes in their conditions. Together with wearing masks, screening staff and following frequent cleaning and hygiene protocols, we have precautions in place to help mitigate the spread when someone becomes ill. We will keep you updated as test results are returned.
