#### **Campus Happenings**

 In early April, we informed everyone that the CDC now requires anyone coming from the hospital to a skilled nursing facility or assisted living program to undergo heightened observations for 14 days, even those not known to have COVID-19. If possible, they require these observation patients to be on a dedicated unit. As a result, any health care center or assisted living resident who returns from the hospital will spend 14 days in observation on this unit before returning to their room. The belief is that this observation period will add another layer of prevention in helping to stop the spread of the virus since symptoms may not appear for up to 14 days. Observation status is not that much different than the precautions we are currently taking except that staff will wear additional PPE.

In addition, if an Independent Living resident returns from the hospital and does not need to be admitted to rehab, they should be self isolating in their apartments for 14 days. Residents who are part of our Supportive Living program will continue to receive help during the isolation period. Those who hadn't previously tapped into this service may want to consider registering for help during this 14day period even if it's just for assistance with daily living tasks rather than medical care needs.
