LIVING OUT OUR MISSION IN THE MIDST OF THE COVID-19 CRISIS



In the face of COVID-19, two things remained true at Luther Manor. First, our number one priority is the health and safety of our residents, staff, providers and community. Second, Luther Manor's mission to "share God's love by enriching the lives of older adults" is lived out each and every day. In love, we protected, informed & enriched.

HOW DID WE PROTECT?

In mid-March, things seemed to be changing every day. We established a task force to monitor & address the changing situation & implement new & necessary precautions - and we have not let up! We continue to restrict, screen & clean.

HOW DID WE INFORM?

From day one, we've made sure that staff, residents, and family members were in the loop via morning broadcasts on our in-house channel, daily emails, dedicated pages on our website, and a 24-hour telephone hotline.

HOW DID WE ENRICH?

Enrichment of the body, mind & spirit while maintaining social distancing certainly took some creativity! We added tons of content to our in-house channel, moved activities to hallways or outdoors, and created virtual & written communication avenues for those within & outside of our community.

Online, we've launched a new website with a fresh look and simplified pathways to answer the most commonly asked questions.







Ritika Patel and Paighten Smith were awarded the SOAR Scholarship, a scholarship made possible by donors honoring Lori Schultz when she retired last year as Youth and Family Volunteer Specialist. Lori's love of butterflies inspired the scholarship's name.

Ritika Patel is studying Biology at Rensselear Polytechnic Institute in New York under the accelerated program in which she will continue her studies to become a doctor at Albany Medical College. Despite the challenges of COVID-19, Ritika has been able to attend

her biology and chemistry labs in person. She is finding the freedom of college invigorating, and is already looking forward to the next few years. "The SOAR Scholarship is helping me accomplish my dreams," Ritika said. The generous award is helping her meet the expenses of her education, relieving some of the stress of affording college.

VOLUNTEER SERVICES IN A COVID-19 WORLD

2020 started off as a year of areat promise but as the year was progressing so was the information about a health crisis starting on the other side of the world. On Friday, March 13 Volunteers were opening the Little Shoppe, preparing the Health Care Center Coffee Cart and transporting residents to Therapy appointments. Special Event volunteers were partnering with Life Enrichment for a Lumberjack theme lunch for the residents. That day Luther Manor received information from the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and Department of Health Services (DHS) to only allow essential staff in the community going forward as an




